Frank Reinecke was born in Görlitz. He studied at the Hochschule für Musik "Hanns Eisler" Berlin in the class of Prof. Eberhard Feltz.

Since its foundation in 1985 he is the second violinist of the Vogler Quartet. The ensemble studied in Berlin and Cincinnati and worked with Eberhard Feltz, Walter Levin, György Kurtág, Sándor Végh. After winning the International String Quartet Competition in Evian/France in 1986 the quartet has given extensive concert tours in Europe, USA, Canada, New Zealand, Australia and Japan and recorded numerous Radio and CD productions.

Frank Reinecke was for many years artistic director of the "Music in Drumcliffe Festival" in Sligo (Ireland) and organizes concertseries for the Vogler Quartet in the Konzerthaus Berlin and Neubrandenburg together with the other members of the quartet. He has given masterclasses for chamber music at the „International Chamber Music Campus of the Jeunesses Musicales" in Schloss Weikersheim, the „Schubertiade" in Schwarzenberg and the "McGill International String Quartet Academy" in Montreal as well as in Toronto, Cincinnati, Denver, Calgary, Trondheim, Kuhmo, Riga and Dijon.

Since autumn of 2017, Frank Reinecke is a member of the Berlin based Aperto Piano Quartet. In recent years, he was invited to various festivals such as "Classix Kempten", "Sommerliche Musiktage Hitzacker" and "WestfalenClassics" to perform chamber music with colleagues and friends.

He was teaching chamber music at the Hochschule für Musik "Hanns Eisler" Berlin and as a guest Professor for violin at the Hochschule für Musik Detmold. From 2007 to 2012 he was Professor of chamber music at the Hochschule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst Stuttgart. In 2012 Frank Reinecke was appointed as Professor for string chamber music at the Hochschule für Musik und Theater „Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy" Leipzig.
